OFFICIAL WARNING

To the Legal Occupier,

Our Enforcement Division has identified that there is no record of a TV Licence at your address, and that you may therefore be watching or recording television programme services without a valid licence. If this is the case, you are breaking the law.

Enforcement Officers have been authorised by us to visit your address in _____ to interview you under caution in compliance with the Police and Criminal Evidence Act 1984*.

If we find that you watch or record television without a licence, your statement will be the first step towards prosecution. Should you be convicted, your name will be added to our National Enforcement Database and the court can impose a fine of up to £1,000.

Officers from our Enforcement Division catch 71,043 people every year.

To avoid a potential court appearance, you are strongly advised to call 0870 241 7204 now, to purchase a licence. The quickest way to pay is by debit or credit card, which we can arrange over the phone. We will be happy to discuss your individual TV licensing requirements and answer any questions you may have.
